Learn about landslides that may threaten your property and ways we can work together to reduce the risks.

Join fellow property owners and residents along the Seattle to Everett BNSF railroad tracks for discussions with the Washington State Department of Transportation, BNSF Railway, Sound Transit, local jurisdictions, and other partners.

More than 200 landslides have occurred in the past 10 years along

the Seattle to Everett coastline, damaging property and blocking rail lines. Landslides can be the result of improper slope management or drainage problems that can be prevented or lessened. We need your help to prevent landslides and make the coastal bluff corridor safer for everyone.

The May 25 meeting will include:

- Warning signs of potential landslides

- Tips on how you can reduce landslide risks to safeguard your investment
- Information about resources and programs to help maintain property
- An update on WSDOT landslide mitigation projects near Everett and Mukilteo – and information on future projects
- Small group settings and chance to ask questions of experts
