



TRANSPORTATION UPDATE



Today, our streets are in good shape! The City manages 61 miles of streets, 95% are in Good or Very Good condition, and our current pavement rating is 77/100.



The City has a Bike, Transit, Walking (BTW) Plan to make strategic investments in bike and pedestrian safety.



Keeping our streets in good condition requires regular repair and maintenance. If we do regular maintenance now, we avoid more expensive total rebuilds in the future.



The BTW Plan focuses on safe routes for kids to bike and walk to school, and building connections to regional bike and trail systems as early priorities.



The City formed a taskforce of residents and business owners to review our plans and they agreed that we should be spending \$900,000 per year on street repair and maintenance.



The Planning Commission recommended \$435,000 per year be invested in bike, transit and walking projects, but the City has averaged less than \$100,000 per year.



Over the last nine years, we have invested an average of \$470,000 per year, an amount that is significantly less than the \$900,000 recommended by the taskforce. If this spending disparity continues, there is a risk that the condition of the City's streets will deteriorate.

The City Council has placed a measure on the ballot in November to raise the sales tax by 0.1% (1 cent on a \$10 purchase, and less than \$10 a year for the average person).



The extra tax:

- ★ Would last for 10 years, at which point voters would have to vote again for it to be extended
- ★ Dedicated to transportation, could not be used for general City expenses
- ★ Be paid by residents and visitors alike
- ★ Cost the average taxpayer less than \$10 per year



If we invest according to our plan, every street in the City will be repaired and maintained over a 20-year span.



Cars aren't the only things on our streets. Statistics show that 1/3 of our residents can't drive. The City's goal is to make sure everyone can connect to where they need to go in our community.



The City is currently working on the new design for the Harbour Reach Corridor Project. This project will construct a new urban arterial connecting Beverly Park Road to Harbour Pt Blvd SW and will make improvements to Harbour Reach Drive between Harbour Pt Blvd SW and Harbour Pt Blvd North to improve traffic flow and bicycle safety.

Once complete, the corridor will include one lane in each direction with bicycle lanes, landscaping and sidewalks on both sides of the street from Harbour Pt Blvd North to Beverly Park Road. In order to improve intersection safety and enhance traffic calming, the City is examining several locations for potential roundabouts.




DESIGNING THE FUTURE

In June, the City completed its preliminary design (Phase I) for the Harbour Reach Corridor Project.

This design incorporated feedback from the Community Workshop that the City hosted last October. Based on feedback heard at the workshop and throughout the preliminary design process, some design features have been improved to provide:

- *natural screening from the new roadway*
- *bicycle/pedestrian connectivity throughout the project*
- *additional signage to emphasize and enhance safety*
- *better accommodation for larger vehicles at roundabouts and medians*

The final design (Phase II) process began this month, and the City is considering other public amenities, such as decorative lighting, public art, seating areas and wildlife lookouts along the corridor. This Open House will be your opportunity to share your ideas and priorities as we move forward to complete final design by the spring of 2018.
