RECOMMENDATION: Commission discussion about the 6-Year Transportation Improvement Plan for years 2023-2028, with City Council action scheduled for June 21, 2022.

SUMMARY:

RCW 35.77.010 requires each city or town to annually adopt a six-year transportation program. This program is commonly referred to as the "6-Year Transportation Improvement Program" or TIP and is an extension of the City's Comprehensive Plan. This proposed document was reviewed by the Infrastructure Committee at their April 18, 2022, and May 23, 2022, meetings and the Committee's feedback has been incorporated into the draft TIP documents.

Staff will return to Council on June 21, 2022 to conduct a public hearing and seek adoption of the 6-Year TIP.

BACKGROUND:

The primary purpose of the TIP is to identify transportation projects that are, or may become, eligible for federal, state and/or local funding. The City keeps the TIP consistent with the Capital Facilities Plan, <u>BTW Plan</u>, and the <u>Transportation element of the Comprehensive Plan</u> (pages 73-104).

At the April and May Infrastructure Committee meetings the proposed revisions to the six-year TIP were reviewed.

Projects Modified:

- SR525 bridge replacement was funded.
- Project cost estimates were increased to accommodate inflation and expenditure schedules were adjusted to better reflect future funding opportunities.

As with each annual update of the TIP, this is the list of projects that we can reasonably expect to make progress on in the next six years. Progress may include, but is not limited to, grant applications, feasibility analysis, pre-design, design, right-of-way acquisition, and construction.





PROJECT A – Funded through WSDOT – Design in final



Pedestrian and Access Improvements, including widening the existing SR 525 bridge eastern sidewalk, re-configuring the existing lanes, and upgrade curb ramps to meet current ADA standards.

Estimated Costs: \$1,316,000

Delivery Schedule:

Engineering - 2021 Construction – 1st Year



PROJECT B – Funded Through STP Preservation



Extend the life of the pavement on 47th PI W by completing pavement grinding, HMA overlay, full depth pavement repair where needed, curb ramp upgrades to comply with ADA requirements, restriping, and upgraded signage to comply with MUTCD standards. Channelization may also be modified to include bicycle lanes, following an evaluation to determine community desire for this change.

Estimated Costs: \$1,770,000

Replacement of existing bridge. Widen to accommodate pedestrian and bicycle traffic.



PROJECT D – Design Funded through Sound Transit – Design 60% Completed



Pavement Repair and HMA Overlay, storm drainage conveyance, detention, and treatment, curb ramp upgrades, guardrail replacement, illumination, on street bike lane, and shared use path. Was planned to be constructed with Sound Transit funding but that has been pushed out from 2024 to 2034. Will need 20% match to secure alternate grant funding.





A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MUKILTEO, WASHINGTON, ADOPTING A SIX-YEAR TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM AND DIRECTING THE SAME TO BE FILED WITH THE SECRETARY OF TRANSPORTATION AND THE PUGET SOUND REGIONAL COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of RCW Chapters 35.77 and 47.26, the City Council of the City of Mukilteo has previously adopted a Comprehensive Street Program, including an Arterial Street Construction Program, and thereafter periodically modified said Comprehensive Street Program by Resolution, and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed the work accomplished under said program, determined current and future City street and arterial needs, and based upon these findings has prepared a Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program for the ensuing six (6) calendar years, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing has been held on said Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program, and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that there will be no significant adverse environmental impacts as a result of adoption of the Six Year Transportation Program.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MUKILTEO, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVES:



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Community Development Department Weekly Updates

UPDATES FOR THE WEEK OF: May 9, 2022

- With the assistance of staff from several City Departments, approximately 6,000 letters with new two-year resident passes were prepared for mailing to City of Mukilteo households. These resident passes, along with an informational letter, needed to be inserted into mailing envelopes, all in a manner meeting special instructions from the United States Postal Service. Community Development wants to say thank you to staff that were able to participate in this effort, as well as to other staff that covered the work that needed to be done so that their co-workers could assist in this endeavor. THANK YOU AGAIN EVERYONE!
- The City Council Land Use & Economic Development Committee met and discussed a proposed ordinance amending the International Residential Code related to fence permits, incorporating requirements for temporary uses into the zoning code, and also received an update on the status of comprehensive plan/development regulation docket items.
- Permit Services Assistant Martinis provided administrative support for the monthly Parks and Arts Commission meeting.
- Community Development staff met with Community Transit to receive an update on Commute Trip Reduction (CTR) program requirements for 2022, which will include a survey of City employees later this year.

UPDATES FOR THE WEEK OF: May 16, 2022

- Community Development Department and other City staff participated in interviews for the permit services coordinator and associate planner position openings.
- Permit Services Assistant Rizzo prepared and sent out the Planning Commission packets for its May 19, 2022 meeting, which will include a discussion of a mobile food truck code amendment.
- The GIS team met with the consultant doing work on Closed Circuit TV (CCTV) stormwater inspections in preparation for the upcoming CCTV stormwater pipe inspections beginning in June.
- The GIS team has also been working with the Public Works Department on stormwater facility data maintenance and on updating data pertaining to weekly pipe cleaning by the storm crew.
- Community Development staff met with FEMA to discuss finalizing WSDOT floodplain information in association with the Washington State Ferry terminal project.
- Community Development staff met with Washington State Department of Archeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP) staff to discuss DAHP's attendance at the upcoming May 26, 2022 Historic Commission meeting.

UPDATES FOR THE WEEK OF: May 23, 2022

- The Mukilteo Planning Commission had its monthly meeting and discussed a mobile food truck code amendment.
- Community Development staff joined Public Works staff in a meeting with the 5th Street Pedestrian and Bicycle project consultant to discuss permitting issues.
- Community Development and Public Works staff met with ICOM, to discuss restarting construction of the project after the project suspended construction during the winter months.
- Community Development staff has been meeting with SAFEbuilt, the City's building plan review and building inspection consultant, to coordinate their services given Willie Berns' upcoming retirement, and until such time the City can hire Willie's replacement.
- An interview was for the vacant Associate Planner position.

• The GIS Team continues to work with the Public Works Surface Water Division on storm water data collection data.

UPDATES FOR THE WEEK OF: May 30 2022

- Senior Planner Ritter and Assistant Planner Kress have been working on multiple tree removal requests, including property on Mukilteo Lane.
- The GIS Team attended the Washington GIS Association regional user conference, virtually.
- The Mukilteo Historic Preservation Commission met and heard a general presentation from Washington State Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation staff.
- Community Development, Finance and Public Works staff interviewed several candidates for the Permit Services Assistant position.
