1) Review of 2016 Accomplishments

2) Establish 2017 Goals

The Committee reviewed the goals spreadsheet from the City Council Retreat and identified which goals had been accomplished and which still required review by the Committee. See attached list of 2016 Accomplishments and 2017 Committee Goals.

There was some discussion by the Committee of street trees and tree cutting policies. Evaluation of the City's tree code has been identified in the Planning & Community Development Director's long-range departmental plan.

The Committee also requested to see the creation of a long-term plan for Public Works similar to the plan presented to Council at the retreat by the Planning & Community Development Department.

- **3) Capital Projects Update:** The Committee was updated on the status of several underway capital projects.
 - a) **61**st **Place Culvert** Staff is close to having identified design revisions that appear acceptable to the Tulalip Tribes. Staff will report back at the March Infrastructure Committee meeting with estimated total project costs based on the proposed design revisions.

- b) **FS24 & FS25 Emergency Generator** The current consultant proposal for design, bidding and construction consultant services is approximately \$52,000, approximately \$32,000 of that total budget is for design services only. The combined total project budget of the two projects is \$150,000. The Committee recommended meeting one-on-one with Councilmember Wheeler to discuss the scope of work and project costs prior to bringing the contract to full Council for approval.
- c) SR526 Shared Use Path Staff discussed status of the project. Currently the City has approximately \$293,000 in design funds and \$60,000 in right of way funds for the project. There have been changes to design requirements since the project began in 2010 that may result in needing additional design funds to complete the design. In addition, there are no construction funds identified for the project. When the project as first scoped by the City, it was thought an external agency (such as WSDOT, or Snohomish County) would take the project over at construction and fund the completion of the projects. However at this time, there is no interest from any external agencies to fund the construction and ultimately own the long term maintenance of the proposed path. The Committee requested a full project cost analysis. Staff will report back at the March Infrastructure Committee meeting with estimated total project costs to further the discussion.
- design. The schedule identifies construction for later this year (Fall 2017), however the timing of permitting and ROW acquisition could delay the start date of construction. In addition, costs for ROW acquisition and wetland mitigation were not included in the project budget however, staff is suggesting the donation of ROW by the adjacent property owners as the cost of the frontage improvements they receive with improve their land. The project is proposing to utilize the CAMP program for the wetland mitigation. The approval of the proposed site, located in Japanese Gulch, will be presented to Council on February 13th. The Committee did not present any concerns with the proposed mitigation site in Japanese Gulch.
