*WHEREAS*, women were not free to vote until 1920, when the 19<sup>th</sup> amendment passed, and women of color were not able to vote until 1965, after the Voting Rights Act passed; and

*WHEREAS*, women have worked tirelessly to create equal opportunities, equal pay, and freedom to choose; and

*WHEREAS*, as we celebrate women's achievements, we can all help identify gaps and solutions for ensuring equal opportunities for women.
