

Customized Traffic Action Plan for 92nd Street

Education, Encouragement, and Enforcement

By educating the community and encouraging safe driving, we can begin to change driver behavior and reduce vehicle speeds.



Traffic Enforcement

The Public Works Department works closely with the Police Department to enforce speed limits and other traffic laws in neighborhoods. Using key traffic data provided by Public Works staff, officers focus their scheduled patrols on the times and places where speeding most often occurs. Typically, targeted enforcement occurs during a one-week timeframe. Enforcement is also available by request to Mukilteo residents.

Neighborhood Speed Watch Programs

The Neighborhood Speed Watch is a public awareness program that provides citizens with partnership opportunities

in solving speeding problems in their neighborhood. Residents monitor the speed of vehicles with radar equipment on loan from the Police Department. Police staff train residents on how to use the radar unit to record the license plate numbers of those motorists driving at least 5 mph above the posted speed limit. A letter is sent from the Police Department to the registered owners of those vehicles informing them of the observed violation and encourages them or the other drivers of their vehicle to drive at or below the




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posted speed limit. Since this is a community awareness program, no formal citations or fines are issued.

A short 1 hour training session is provided to the requestor by City staff. The requestor collects motorists' data and submits the results to City Staff. To participate in this program, please call 425.263.8100.

Radar Trailer/Dolly

The radar trailer/dolly is a portable trailer equipped with a radar unit which detects the speed of passing vehicles and displays the speed on a reader board. The goal is to heighten driver's awareness of both the speed at which they are



Police Officers or Police Volunteers will place the radar trailer or dolly at location as requested. The Police Department may use the trailer as a "speed checkpoint" and have an officer present to issue citations to violators.

To request a radar speed trailer be placed at a particular location, call 425.263.8100.

Re: Speeding Concerns on 92nd Street

Dear Mr. Cabanday,

Thank you for contacting the City of Mukilteo and sharing your concerns with vehicle speeds on the 92nd Street SW, 84th Street SW and 44th Ave W. 84th Street, between SR 525 and Paine Field Boulevard, is SR 526 and the Washington State Department of Transportation has jurisdictional control over this area so it was not included in our review. We have completed a field review and data analysis on 92nd Street and compiled this information into this Traffic Action Plan (TAP), as well as our recommendations.

A speed study was conducted in the 4600 Block of 92nd Street SW. The location was selected to capture the highest speeds possible. The speed study began on March 13, 2015 and ended on March 23, 2015. The study shows 85% of motorists are traveling at or below 28 mph in the eastbound direction and at or below 29 mph in the westbound direction. There were 6,944 vehicles recorded traveling eastbound, and 5,681 traveling westbound during the 10 day speed study. An accident study was also conducted on 92nd Street SW and 44th Ave W, and there has been one accident since January 1, 2014.

The speed study identified three times when the speeding occurred most frequently: between the hours of 2300 to 0200 on the weekend; and 0400 to 0600, and 1600 to 1800 hours on the weekday. During the month of April, the Mukilteo Police Department conducted additional traffic enforcement during these times.

Physical measures such as speed humps are presently not warranted as they are limited to streets where 85% of motorists are traveling above 33 mph. These guidelines are established based on the impact these measures have on emergency response, school bus routes, and noise impacts from motorists traversing the speed hump.

To address those motorists choosing to drive faster than the posted speed limit, we encourage you and your neighbors to participate in one of our education programs as described on page 3 of this report. One of the options that would work well for the situation you described is to request a radar trailer/dolly be placed along 92nd Street as well as 44th Street. To request this please call 425.263.8100.
