Dear Garret,

Thank you for contacting the City of Mukilteo and sharing your concerns with vehicle speeds and pedestrians crossing at Cornelia and Mukilteo Boulevard. We have completed a field review and data analysis on Mukilteo Boulevard and compiled this information into this Traffic Action Plan (TAP), as well as our recommendations.

A speed study was conducted on Mukilteo Boulevard, near the crosswalk at Cornelia. The location was selected based on the information you provided in your request for action form. The speed study began on June 17, 2016 and ended on June 27, 2016. The study shows 85% of motorists are traveling at or below 32 mph in the westbound direction and at or below 35 mph in the eastbound direction. There were 29,565 vehicles recorded traveling westbound, and 32,717 traveling eastbound during the 10 day speed study.

The speed study was provided to the Mukilteo Police Department, who will conduct additional traffic enforcement in this area as part of their traffic enforcement emphasis areas.

In addition, the City will install pedestrian activated crosswalk flashing lights for the crosswalk at the intersection of Cornelia and Mukilteo Boulevard. We will be coordinating with our Public Works crew to schedule this for installation by the end of the year. The City is also working on a plan to install pedestrian friendly facilities along Mukilteo Boulevard. To address those motorists choosing to drive faster than the posted speed limit, we encourage you and your neighbors to participate in one of our education programs as described on page 3 of this report.
