

I was proud to join Kamiak students at the Never Again rally, as well as the March for Our Lives. I am inspired by these young leaders and their passion.

*The City Council has discussed two **2018 Action Agenda** priorities recently, a biennial budget to push us to look at a longer horizon for our finances, and renewing the EMS levy at the rate adopted by voters in 2011. These conversations will continue into May. I hope to see you during our great Garage Sale this Saturday the 28th, and at the City's Touch a Truck event on May 12!*

1 Be Well Massage celebrated their grand opening at a new space in the Sterling Business Park, inside Mukilteo.

2 Mayor Gregerson joined City staff to prepare the waterfront Parking Permit mailing, helping to stuff 5,000 envelopes with 10,000 passes. These passes allow for free parking for residents on the waterfront, and should arrive in the mail this week. If you still need to apply, you can find the [application online here](#).

3 A brand new sweeper truck was added to the Public Works fleet, helping to clear drains and keep our streets clean. This \$310,000 truck will be out to show off at the City's Touch a Truck event at Rosehill on May 12th, and was funded with your stormwater fees.

4 New raised pavement street markers will remind drivers to keep to their lanes around the curves on Washington Avenue, 6th St, and Lincoln Avenue.

5 Volunteers were thanked by all City staff, and many members of the Police Department,

including emcee Ranger Bohan, at the annual Volunteer Appreciation dinner. Volunteer work is key to the City's mission, and we appreciate their efforts to make this a wonderful place to live.

6 Sparky the fire dog welcomed kids and families to the Annual Easter Egg Hunt, sponsored by the Firefighters' Benevolent Fund.

7 Mayor Gregerson celebrated the opening of the family-owned Simulation Flight business, located at Sterling Business Park and helping to train pilots on numerous types of aircraft.

8 Public Works staff installed new radar speed indicator signs to improve safety in our community.

9 Sidewalk repairs were completed on One Clubhouse Lane, improving pedestrian safety. It's a great time to get out and walk your neighborhoods!

10 New pavers were installed at Lighthouse Park, allowing for a better visitor experience. The Lighthouse is officially open through the

summer each weekend, hosted by the Historical Society volunteers.

11 Mayor Gregerson was honored to be one of the speakers at the Kamiak student-led rally on March 30. Student speakers and performers shared their thoughts and concerns about gun safety.

12 New firefighters Frame and Bishop took their oaths of office and joined the ranks of the Mukilteo Fire Department this month.

13 The new Green Business Certification Program, *Mukilteo Cares*, was launched this month. Get Distilled, Gompf Brackets and Sound Soul Counseling were the first to pledge to use green practices in their business operations. The Green Business program was a **2017 Action Agenda** item.
