**RECOMMENDATION**

1. Council **MOTION** to pass Ordinance No. 1427 (**Exhibits 1-1, 1-2, and 1-3**) related to updating the Shoreline Master Program and amending Mukilteo Municipal Code (MMC) Title 17B - Shoreline Management Regulations.

*[NOTE: Proposed Ordinance No. 1427 reflects the April 18, 2019 Planning Commission recommendation, with additional amendments to incorporate the August 2, 2019 Department of Ecology recommended and required amendments. In effect, Ordinance No. 1427 represents the Department of Ecology recommendation].*

AND

2. Council **MOTION** to approve Resolution No. 2019-004 (**Exhibit 1-11**) authorizing staff to forward the Shoreline Master Program and all supporting documents to the Washington State Department of Ecology for final approval.

**SUMMARY**

On September 3, 2019, the City Council opened a public hearing on amendments to the City of Mukilteo Shoreline Master Program (“SMP”). The amendments are part of a State mandated SMP update process required every eight years.

The City Council action was to continue the public hearing to October 7, 2019 to allow time to thoroughly review the information for the SMP update. The City Council also asked questions and requested additional information.

At the October 7, 2019 continued public hearing, the City Council will determine whether or not to accept the Planning Commission and /or DOE’s recommendations and adopt Ordinance No. 1427 (**see Exhibits 1-1, 1-2, and 1-3**). Ordinance No 1427 would, if passed, approve the SMP Update and amend the City’s Shoreline Management Regulations.

After approval of the Ordinance No. 1427, the City Council may then approve Resolution No. 2019-04 (**Exhibit 1-11**) authorizing staff to forward the amended Shoreline Master Program and all supporting documents to the Washington State Department of Ecology for review and final approval as required by State law.

## **OCTOBER 7, 2019 CONTINUED PUBLIC HEARING - ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

At its September 3, 2019 public hearing, the City Council requested information on the following items:

- Shoreline Management Act (“SMA”) height requirements;
- Height requirements applicable to the NOAA (federally owned) property;
- Properties along the Urban Waterfront shoreline designation subject to the current 25 foot height limitation;
- Whether new mitigation measures can be imposed on previously approved projects;
- How the SMP and shoreline regulation minimize view impacts;
- Parking requirements in shoreline environment areas;
- How projects in the SMP Shoreline Restoration Plan might be reprioritized;
- How frequently the SMP may be amended.

Responses to these questions may be found in **Exhibit 2**.

In addition, two maps showing the 200 foot setback (shoreline jurisdiction) from the estimated Ordinary High Water Mark (“OHWM”) boundary for that part of the City’s shoreline in the “Urban Waterfront” shoreline environment designation are included in **Exhibit 3**. One map depicts the 200 foot OHWM setback with location of the future WSDOT ferry terminal; the other does not.

Finally, **Exhibit 4** is profile imaging (cross sections) of the waterfront from three (3) different locations using 3D Light Detection and Ranging (LiDAR) mapping. These images illustrate the difference in elevation between properties along the waterfront and properties located on the bluff above. This range in elevation is based on height above sea level.

## **ALTERNATIVES**

Council may:

- Pass Ordinance No. 1427, as presented, which incorporates the Planning Commission recommendation, as revised by the DOE comments.
- Amend and then pass Ordinance No. 1427, as amended.
- Continue the public hearing to accept additional public comment and/or discuss other alternatives.
