IMPROVE ACCESSIBILITY AND MOBILITY

- Attended SCCIT (Snohomish County Committee for Improved Transportation) meeting. We talked about regional transportation issues and ways to be most effective within Snohomish County. Topics included: an update on a negotiation between state and local leaders regarding the distribution of federal transportation funding from the FAST Act, which is federal freight mobility legislation and Sound Transit 3 package which is now before the voters for the November election. For the ST3 projects within Snohomish County, the Cities of Lynnwood and Everett and Snohomish County have a working group that aims to ensure the planning and development process works smoothly.

SUPPORT A HEALTHY ECONOMY

- Attended the Chamber of Commerce monthly breakfast and connected with business owners and community members.
- Attended the Chamber of Commerce executive board meeting and shared updates from the City and heard about their efforts regarding tourism and connecting with our business community.

A HEALTHY AND SAFE COMMUNITY

- Discussed school partnerships and open communications with School District Superintendent Marci Larsen. I was excited to hear that the 2016-2017 school budget includes partial funding for a school resource officer. Our Crime Prevention Officer will be connecting with district staff to

- discuss how Mukilteo can be a part of this initiative.
- Attended the first ever Junior Ranger graduation with Ranger Peg Bohan and 25 excited Mukilteo Elementary School students. They demonstrated their understanding and respect of the natural environment.



The Chamber of Commerce "Varoom!" Car Show was a big success, including a welcoming presentation of mustang cars and plane!

WATERFRONT

- Attended the Mukilteo Multimodal Ferry Terminal Project Tank Farm Coordination Meeting. NOAA is almost done with their evaluation of their property options (using their current site or swapping with the future park property closer to the base of the old pier). They'll be updating the community and Council at the August 5th Council meeting. The NOAA funding package is in both the House and Senate budgets, so they are just waiting for passage of the budget. Funding would be allocated in October 2016 (or when a budget is passed) through 2019. Sound Transit has been working with City staff to come to agreement on how their station fits into the rest of the development, especially regarding stormwater. The City is working through the Parking Facility Feasibility Study, as well as the design process with WSDOT for the separate pedestrian

bridge with WSDOT. Washington State Ferries had their first meeting with the construction coordinator who will be responsible for the review of the ferry project as it moves towards construction. WSF is moving towards an early 2017 advertisement date for the next construction phase of the terminal project. City staff reminded WSF of the need to tackle transportation mitigation as part of compliance with the shoreline permit conditions from the hearing examiner.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

- Visited Harbour Pointe Senior Living facility and spoke with residents about Mukilteo history, progress on my action agenda, the Wise Investment in Transportation Taskforce report, current capital projects. Harbour Pointe Blvd and 5th Street pavement preservation is scheduled for next year, in order to take advantage of a better bidding climate versus this fall. Design work on the 61st Place culvert continues, and a project in Naketa Beach is closer to construction. Both those projects will help our stormwater system. As part of our pavement preservation program, in July, our consultant will be visiting all of our city streets and rating the pavement condition, in order to assess our needs and status.
- Attended the monthly Mukilteo Historical Society meeting. The speaker shared new information about the background of our Fresnel lens in the light station, and disproved a prior understanding of its provenance! Members were excited to learn new information about it.

REGIONAL PARTNERSHIPS

- Met with Governor In-slee's Northwest Director, Julia Terlinchamp, to discuss Mukilteo priorities and opportunities.
- Met with Katrina Ondracek of United Way, to discuss their community support efforts and ways to be impactful in Mukilteo. They recently conducted a poverty simulation in Arlington, where community members were able to spend a few hours considering and experiencing the impacts and challenges of living in poverty. We talked about doing a similar event in the Mukilteo area.
