


Q1 Which neighborhood best represents where you live?









These kinds of surveys dwell on what do people want without incorporating the cost of what they say they want and how much are they personally willing to pay for more and in what kind of tax our other funding source. If you told people how much more it will cost them for each thing they want the requests for more would be much smaller. The city cannot fund street maintenance while spending a huge amount on parks and recreation. How many of our 21,000 residents use each facility and how much do they use them ? Most have not been to many of the facilities mentioned in this questionnaire even once annually. Most of the facilities are for fitness which does not require an expensive community center, just a large enough room for the participants to work out. Our prior community center used to be used for art, music, dance, theater and basketball with some fitness use. And it was operated at minimal cost. Compare the operating cost of the community centers starting at 2005 to now and see how the cost went from almost nothing to about \$400,000 a year now, if you add all the costs that have been moved into the Public Works budget such as utilities, insurance, janitorial, building maintenance and landscaping and grounds care. The parks and recreation budget only has about half the costs of operating Rosehill now compared to the earlier budgets. So it makes it look like the operating costs are supportable but they mask the real costs of operation. Now a lot of taxpayer money has been spent on Japanese Gulch which started out being considered for acquisition to maintain the historical environment (see the voter pamphlet when voters were asked if they would pay a bond issue to acquire the gulch). Now Japanese Gulch is being developed into a park and the City spent \$1.5 million most recently to acquire it after the voters did not approve the bond issue and are spending thousands to convert it into a park. I doubt most of the 21,000 residents have never set foot in Japanese Gulch and could care less. Same with 92nd St Park. And now a new park is in the budget to remember students who were murdered. That park will require maintenance as well as the expenditure to acquire or develop that park, if completed. Park and recreation spending needs to be reduced, not increased with taxpayer dollars spent on essential city services which should be prioritized--public safety, streets, building and development compliance. 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


